If you have a phone, you need to enable data usage, get a data plan if you don't have one already, download the Service Victoria app from Play store or App store, skip the first two pages and go to "quick check-in", line up your phone so that the QR code is within the frame on camera, hold still for a moment, and when it takes you to the St James page, type in your first name and your phone and click to register your attendance. You will soon get used to it.

PARISH NEWS REFLECTION: Luke 2:21-40 - The Greatest Revelation

Some are saying that they thought they had seen it all, until 2020! Drought, bushfires, COVID, and now flooding!

Have you had one of those moments when suddenly the penny drops and you understand something amazing for the first time? You might call it a Revelation.

When Simeon and Anna saw the baby Jesus presented in the temple on his eighth day, they knew that this was the most wonderful thing they would ever see. The long-awaited Messiah has come. God has come to save his people.



Many had this experience in seeing Jesus, yet he said to his disciple Nathaniel: "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these." John 1:15.

Following Jesus will lead us to many wonderful Revelations about God, about life and about ourselves. Looking to Jesus is where it all begins.

Here is an outline of this morning's message.

Introduction: What has been your greatest revelation?

- 1. Jesus is revealed to Simeon (25-33)
- a. It had been revealed to him that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. (25-27)
- b. Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace... for my eyes have seen your salvation, (28-33)
- 2. A revelation of both amazingly good news and also deep sorrow.
- a. This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel (34)
- b. And a sword will pierce your own soul too (35)
- 3. Simeon and Anna have now seen the greatest revelation of all (36-40)
- a. They worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day (37).
- b. Anna began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem (38)
