A READING – Isaiah 65.17-25

A reading from the book of Isaiah Chapter 65 beginning at the 17th verse:

¹⁷ For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth;

the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind.

¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice for ever in what I am creating;

for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight.

¹⁹ I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people;

no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it, or the cry of distress.

No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old person who does not live out a lifetime;

for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.

- ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit.
- ²² They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands.


NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING: 12PM SUNDAY 24 NOVEMBER

CHANGE AND UNCERTAINTY IN OUR MIDST

- SO BEWARE AND ENDURE

Our Gospel reading from Luke 21:5-19 reminds us that change and uncertainty is always in our midst. Some of Jesus' disciples remark about one of the great structures of the ancient world, the temple in Jerusalem. In Jesus' day, the grand rebuilding program, commenced by



King Herod (37 BC - 4 AD), was now complete. So the disciples highlight the temple's beauty, especially its noble stones and unique ornaments. But Jesus responds in stark contrast: "The days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." Indeed, nothing lasts forever, except for God's Kingdom and glory. Amidst change and uncertainty, Jesus says, 'Beware that you are not led astray.' Indeed, the temple is completely destroyed around 35 years later (70 AD) by the Romans, never to be rebuilt.

But a bigger change and transformation will commence at the end of this week: Jesus will be arrested and mocked by the temple leaders, unjustly trialled and crucified outside Jerusalem. He will die for the sins of the world, but rise again to launch God's new kingdom. So Jesus doesn't want his followers to be unaware. Much change and uncertainty will continue for Jesus' disciples, as the church is persecuted and scattered to the ends of the earth. But amidst change, uncertainty, trials and opposition, we can hold onto Jesus and his kingdom: 'For by your endurance you will gain your souls' (21:19).



'For the Lord God is my strength and my song: and has become my salvation.'


With joy you will draw water: from the wells of salvation.

FIRST READING - 2 Thessalonians 3.6-13

A reading from Paul's Second letter to the Thessalonians Chapter 3 beginning at the 6th verse:

⁶ Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸ and we did not □

eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹ This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹ For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹² Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

Hear the word of the Lord, Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING - Luke 21.5-19

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke Chapter 21 beginning at the 5th verse: Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ



⁵ When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, [Jesus] said, ⁶ 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.' ⁷ They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' ⁸ And he said, 'Beware that you are not led

astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them. 9 'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' 10 Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; 11 there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 12 'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. 13 This will give you an opportunity to testify. 14 So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; 15 for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. 16 You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. 17 You will be hated by all because of my name. 18 But not a hair of your head will perish. 19 By your endurance you will gain your souls.
