


PARISH NEWS

PARISH NEWS REFLECTION - Isaac and Rebekah

Do we really need to know about how Isaac met Rebekah?

Let us consider what the apostle Paul says when considering the importance of the Old Testament scriptures. He says: "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16-17.



Indeed, as we look at this account, we learn of God's

faithfulness in answering prayer and providing for his people. We see how God's covenant promises are carried forward from generation to generation. And we learn of the importance of choosing a spouse wisely.

The Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were not perfect, but they teach us a lot and the New Testament regularly draws on them to teach us how to live. Let us approach Genesis 24 with expectant hearts and minds willing to learn.

Genesis 24 - Isaac and Rebekah

- 1. God's promise to Abraham continues through Isaac.
- a. God's covenant promise with Abraham is carried through his son Isaac.
- b. Abraham sends his servant to find a suitable wife for Isaac (4).
- c. He prays to God and God grants him his request (43-45).
- 2. Why is a suitable wife so important?
- a. In Hebrew culture, it was the woman who raises the children and has the stronger influence on the faith of the children.
- b. Marrying someone of different convictions can lead to many compromises.
- 3. Rebekah was God's provision:
- a. Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent (67)
- b. He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her.
- c. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.
